'On the closure of three post offices, some numbers had to be re-allotted about 1 November 1862 (if not on that day)." Accordingly, all the post towns using the numbers from "A38" to "A59" inclusive were moved down the list one place or more, an effort being made to keep the list in alphabetical sequence as three new post offices had to be included.
