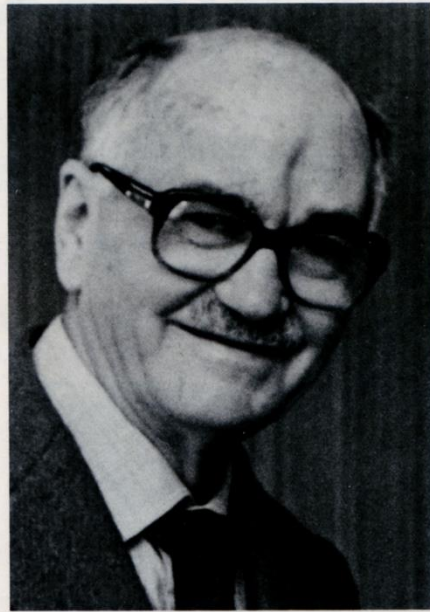

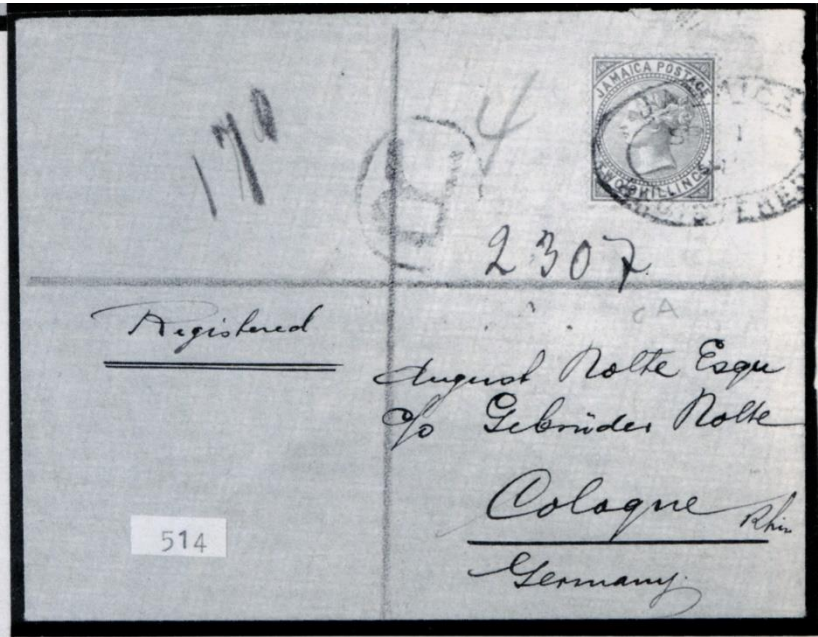


**Harold Bruce Macmillan O.B.E., F.R.P.S.L.  
1907 – 1984**

For some 50 years Mr. Macmillan worked for the well-known Printing Company, R. B. Macmillan Ltd. He retired as Chairman in 1982 when he was made Honorary President of the Company. He had served on many local and national printing committees. During the last war he served with distinction in the Western Desert.

He was a generous supporter of many Charities and was strongly committed to the cause of Cancer Relief (which was founded by his uncle, Douglas Macmillan). At the time of his death Mr. Macmillan was Senior Trustee of the Society and recently he had played a very active part in establishing the Nightingale Macmillan Home for Cancer Sufferers in Derby.

Mr. Macmillan loved his stamps. His interests were wide indeed and although he always considered himself to be a "stamp collector" he possessed deep philatelic knowledge. He was a keen member of the West African Study Circle and a Fellow of the Society of Postal Historians. He was always happy to share his knowledge with other collectors and his displays to Societies were invariably accompanied by talks which were models of lucidity.
