* The Island Police Constabulary Force ceased from the 1 st May on the expiration of the temporary Act 13 Vict. c. 3 which was continued to that day by 14 Vict. Sess 3 c. 9. During the remainder of the year there was a Parochial Constabulary established under 14 Vict. Sess 3. c. 54 without any Central Government. Under the Act 14 Vict. Sess 3. c. 61 the Inspector General received £200 and each of the Inspectors except Mr. Marleton who had died prior to that Act's passing received £150, the Act stating with reference to the Inspectors that the grant was in consequence of the expiring of the late Police Bill and the Police Bill which failed during the present Session. £120 was granted under the same act to 6 Gentlemen to be applied in aid of the children of James C. Marleton.
