GREAT BRITAIN—Letter mail to and from Great Britain and Europe was conveyed by steamers of Elders and Fyffes, Jamaica Banana Producers' Association, Ltd., and Standard Fruit and Steamship Co., (via Liverpool, Bristol, Garston or London), and also via New York.
