FOREWORD.

A competitive Stamp Exhibition will be held in Kingston from February 21st, to February 26th, 1927.

This will be the second exhibition of stamps held in Jamaica under the auspices of the Jamaica Philatelic Society.

The Exhibition Committee has received assurance of approval and cordial support from many philatelists in Jamaica and other parts of the world. Exhibits will be welcomed from all classes of Collectors, and will be judged according to their merits and without prejudice as to ownership. The Committee desires the co-operation of all who are interested in stamp collecting and is especially hopeful that many fine collections will be sent to the Exhibition, so that it may be thoroughly representative.

The benefit to be derived from such an Exhibition must be apparent to everyone. It will afford opportunity for the display of study and research, showing to collectors the progress of philately and to those in Jamaica who are not familiar with stamp collecting the recreation and information which are to be gained by the pursuit.

Exhibitors may feel assured that every provision will be made for safeguarding the exhibits, and every possible precaution will be taken to protect them from loss or injury. Arrangements will be made for insurance against loss by fire, if the Committee is requested to do so. For further particulars we refer to the accompanying Rules and Regulations.

Postage Stamps are not subject to customs duty in Jamaica and arrangements will be made to pass exhibits from abroad through the custom house, unopened, or at any rate, with as little handling as possible and for the examination to be made in the presence of a member of the Exhibition Committee.

Intending exhibitors are especially requested to send full particulars of their exhibits as early as possible. By so doing they will lighten the work of the Exhibition Committee.

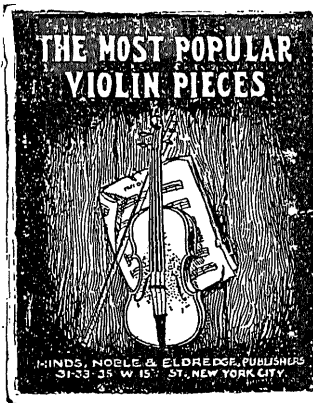

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All Exhibits entered for competition must be bona-fides the property of the Exhibitor. Exhibitors in the Junior Class must, if called upon to do so, furnish evidence of age which shall be satisfactory to the Exhibition Committee.

2. Each exhibit intended for competition must be entered in the class appropriate to it. Exhibits which the owners may desire to enter "not for competition" will be so marked and shown in their proper classes and for which no charge will be made.

3. All exhibits of stamps for display in frames, must be mounted on loose sheets or cards. A portion of an exhibit may be shown in frames and the remainder held for examination by the Judges. The following charges will be made:

CHARGES.

Frames 24 inches wide by 11 inches high.

Charge per Entry in each Class 2/-.

Entries in the Junior Class 1/- each.

No exhibit will be shown unless the prescribed charges are paid in full before the Exhibition opens. There will be no extra charge for frames.

4. Exhibits should be insured independently by the Exhibitor but the Exhibition Committee will arrange if requested to do so, insurance against theft and fire, for which the Exhibitor will be charged actual rates.

5. Exhibits must be forwarded and returned at the expense of the owner, both for transportation and insurance. All exhibits will be returned as soon after the close of the Exhibition as possible, in the manner directed by the owners.

6. Notice of the nature and extent of the intended exhibits, together with the value for insurance, if any, should be sent to the Secretary.

7. Exhibits must be delivered between February 1st and February 17th, 1927, to the Secretary, Mr. G. C. Gunter, Jamaica Government Railway, Kingston, Jamaica.

8. The Exhibition Committee reserves the right to reject any exhibit, or any part of an exhibit, without assigning any reason for such rejection.

9. In the event of there being insufficient space available for displaying the whole of an exhibit, the Exhibition Committee reserves the right to show only such part of the exhibit as it may select.

10. Albums of stamps shewn will be opened at interesting pages. Such albums may not be inspected, except by the Judges, or in the presence of the owner or a member of the Committee.

11. No exhibit or part of an exhibit may be removed prior to the close of the Exhibition.

12. The Judges have been appointed by the Committee of the Jamaica Philatelic Society and their decision will in all cases be final. They shall have power to withhold any award where, in their opinion, there is insufficient competition, or other reason which makes it seem desirable to do so, and they may, with the approval of the Exhibition Committee, increase the number of the awards where the competition justifies it.

The Judges will be requested to base their awards on a consideration of the following qualifications:

Completeness,
Rarity,
Condition,
Arrangement and neatness.

13. The Exhibition Committee will gladly accept offers of special prizes and any Society or individual wishing to donate money towards the Exhibition may do so with the assurance that their assistance will be appreciated. Appropriate inscriptions on medals may be made, and the donors' names may also be inscribed if it is desired.

14. Judges may compete for awards but shall not act as Judges in any section in which they are exhibiting.

15. No single exhibit may be entered in more than one class or section or may receive more than one award. There is, however, no limit to the number of exhibits a collector may enter in one or more classes or sections.

16. All questions that may arise concerning the Exhibition and not provided for by these Rules and Regulations will be decided by the Exhibition Committee.

17. An Exhibitor will be required to state definitely when sending in his or her entries that these rules and regulations are understood and accepted.

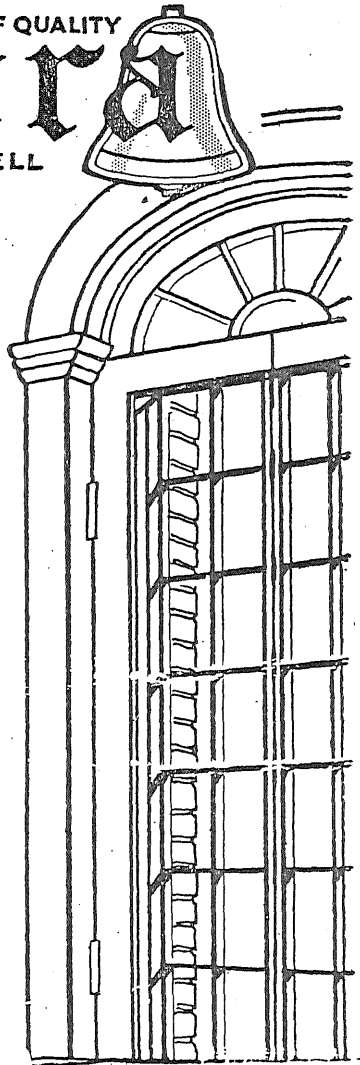

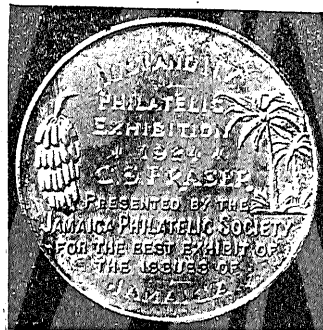

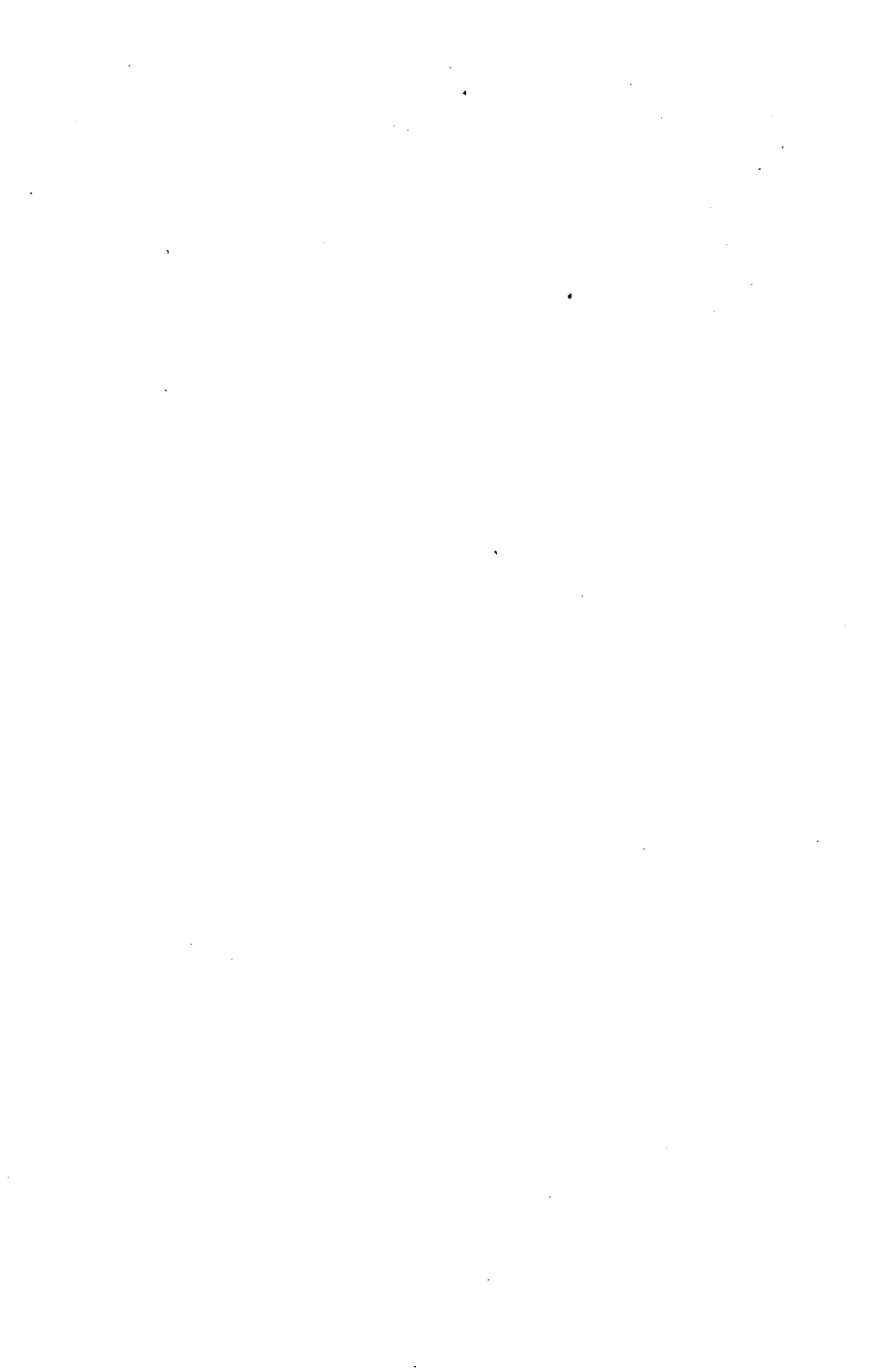
